


We can't wait to start learning and teaching in a space designed for our unique Intensive English High School.



When students participate in sport activities, the navy t-shirt can be worn.







LEARNING NEWS

VISUAL ARTS


We have seen many creative opportunities in visual arts this term. Students have been working on images from nature using their own photographs to create new works in abstract forms.

SPORT








